THE STATE AND ACCOMPLISHMENT OF KITAOTAO IN 2024

In Year 2024, the approved Annual Budget is **THREE HUNDRED SEVENTY-FIVE MILLION EIGHT HUNDRED TEN THOUSAND AND FOUR HUNDRED FIFTY-NINE PESOS (PHP375,810,459.00)**. This budget is 10% lower than the year 2022 budget. This constrained the LGU to fund only programs, projects and activities (PPAs) that are very necessary to promote the welfare of the people and to fund the basic institutional requirements to sustain the operations of the local government. These PPAs are designed to ensure continuity and sustainability, harmonization and synchronization of projects that are previously implemented.

The administration of Mayor Edwin P. Abucayan had supported the casual and regular employees by sending them to training programs on Unionism, Value Formation, Human Resource Development and Skills Development, benchmarking in General Santos City, Nasipit, Agusan del Norte and Dapitan City Hall for actual viewing of office set-up and logistics which activity helped in promoting competency and work efficiency among employees. Team-building activities by KURFME members with the municipal officials and office heads were also done simultaneously during the benchmarking to facilitate better communication, imbibe high-impact learnings and increase team skills to improve morale and productivity.

The **Human Resource Management Office** has been complementing the initiatives of the Local Chief Executive by implementing programs for the purpose of providing excellent customer service, design and improve people management policies.

The various activities conducted to motivate employees are the following:

- **Retirement Program** to give honor and celebrate the dedicated service of the retiree.
- Celebration of the 124th Philippine Civil Service Anniversary last September 9-30, 2024, embodying the mantra of "Gawing Lingkod Bayani ang Bawat Kawani"
- Recruitment, Selection and Placement recruited eight (8) Plantilla positions and Sixty-eight (68) Administrative Aide I.
- Basic Customer Service Skills Training conducted last November 26-27, 2024 with fifty (50) participants designed to improve customer satisfaction and service efficiency. Peace and Order

Under Oplan Double Barrel, or the intensified campaign to suppress the spread of illegal drugs within the municipality, regular anti-drug operations resulted in the arrest of individuals involved in drug-related activities. We have also accomplished illegal Gambling, Loose Firearms, Carnapping, Most Wanted Person, Other Wanted Person.

In terms of Strengthening Community Relations, meetings and dialogs were held to enhance collaboration between police and local communities. These contacts enabled the Police to collect input and address public safety issues. Community Policing Programs, were launched such as Revitalized Pulis sa Barangay and Barangay Anti-Crime Watch, in which personnel were assigned to closely monitor and engage with citizens identified in the Barangay Development Programs Target List. This project enhanced trust between the police and the people, leading to more crime reporting.

The majority of police officers received advanced training in crime investigation, human rights, and disaster response through collaboration with the Higher Offices. This has boosted their ability and readiness to handle complex instances and emergencies.

This station successfully coordinated various disaster risk reduction drills in collaboration with Municipal Disaster Management Office. These drills have improved police ability to respond quickly to natural calamities and other emergencies, ensuring the safety of the public.

Despite efforts to involve communities, areas of resistance remain, particularly in areas impacted by illegal drug operations. To solve these problems, continuous community engagement is important. To keep up the war on illegal substances, increase in the number of intelligence-driven operations and obtaining support from partner agencies were resorted.

Public Employment Service Office

PESO Kitaotao widely implemented around the Municipality and its general objectives guarantee the job seekers within its locality will get updated information about employment and other DOLE Programs. The following activities they have conducted are the following:

• Special Program for Employment of Students (June 10, 2024 – July 8, 2024)

This program aims to encourage the youth's sense of community and aspiration for a positive environmental outlook. A total of 59 grantees/students under DOLE and LGU.

 Tulong Panghanapbuhay sa ating Disadvntaged/Displaced Workers (TUPAD)

A total of 390 beneficiaries are chosen for the assistance that provides emergency employment for displaced workers, underemployed and seasonal workers, for a minimum of 30 days depending on the nature of work to be performed.

Livelihood Assistance to Parents of Child Laborers

Parents of child laborers are among the priority beneficiaries under the DOLE Integrated Livelihood and Emergency Employment Program (DILEEP). A total of 55 beneficiaries received the Livelihood Assistance.

Awards and Recognition

Through the efforts of PESO of the Local Government Unit of Kitaotao received an Award and recognition given by DOLE of Region 10 on December 4, 2024 as "Best Performing Peso" 1st Class Municipality Category for attaining the 100% rating in Employment facilitation.

- Received an award: Green Banner for 3 consecutive years

D. DISASTER RISKS REDUCTIONS AND MANAGEMENT SERVICES

In Year 2024, MDRRM Office has further strengthened mechanisms for partnership and networking with the private sector, CSOs an volunteer groups in 35 Barangay Disaster Risk Reduction and Managements Operations Center. The RDANA Team was also organized and trained. As a result of these initiatives, The

Municipal Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Office (MDRRMO) and the Municipal Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Council (MDRRMC) is recognized as **BEYOND COMPLIANT GAWAD KALASAG SEAL CY 2024**.

The Municipal Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Office has accomplished the following:

- 1. Conducted All Hazard Incident M anagement Training (4th Level ICS) held at Princess del Leonor Hotel and Resort, Kiamba, Sarangani on January 28 February 2, 2024 The Incident Command System Training is a ladderised training course wherein participants must be able to complete the lower-level trainings in order to qualify for the next succeeding training levels. Although MDRRM Council members and next-in-rank employees has been trained on Basic ICS Training, only 18 were able to complete all the four levels of the Incident Command System Training. This training is certainly beneficial in the municipality since this will aid us on planned and large-scale incidents.
- 2. A total of 7 barangays—Tandong, Sinuda, Cabalantian, Sinuda, Tawas, Metebagao, and Lorega—have been trained for the Barangay Response and Preparedness Training. This is an Information, Education, and Communication (IEC) Program implemented by the MDRRM Personnel and Staff as part of the mandates indicated in Section 12 of RA 101211 (4) that the MDRRMO must "organize and conduct training, orientation, and knowledge management activities on disaster risk reduction and management at the local level". Barangay Magsaysay has also requested for this training to be conducted to their barangay on July 17, 2024.
- 3. The Philippine Red Cross Bukidnon Chapter has also conducted trainings to the barangays that are geometrically close to the Salug River. These trainings are intended to capacitate these barangays during disastrous events due to the fact that they are susceptible to flood and rain-induced landslide incidents. Hence, they have requested the aid and assistance of the MDRRM Training Team for the conduct of their IEC trainings to barangays: Digongan, Panganan, Kiulom, and Sinuda.
- 4. The Rapid Damage Assessment and Needs Analysis Training was also held and conducted at the Pearlmont Inn Hotel, Limketkai Drive, Cagayan de Oro City, Misamis Oriental from June 25-28, 2024. A total of 25 participants were able to complete the training while one participant only received a certificate of participation.
- 5. The Emergency Response Teams (Bravo and Charlie) of the Operation Center has also responded to a total of 116 cases comprised with 122 rescued individuals constituted with 29 vehicular accidents with 34 rescued patients, and 87 medical cases.
- 6. A total of 4 clearing operations has also been done by some of the responders in the ERT.
- 7. Due to pressing DRRM-related concerns, a total of 3 special/emergency meetings has already been conducted.

- 8. Two mandatory quarterly meeting have also been conducted, convening the MDRRM Council members for the first Quarter and Second Quarter MDRRMC meeting.
- 9. The municipality was also declared to be in a state of calamity through the Sanggunian Bayan Resolution No. 763 s. 2024 with the recommendation of the issued MDRRMC Resolution No. 5 s. 2024. The Municipal Social Welfare and Development Office has requested for relief distribution packs for the affected families due to the manifestations of the dry spell induced by the El Niño Phenomenon.
- 10. The MDRRMC has also issued a total of 7 resolutions with the following issuances.
- 11. The MDRRMO has also compiled the necessary documents needed during the Seal of Good Local Governance 2024.
- 12. The MDRRMO also compiled a total of 173 documents for the Gawad KALASAG Seal of Excellence.
- 13. As for the year 2024, barangays that were trained as of December 16, 2024, are: (1) Sinaysayan (November 14, 2024); (2) Kahusayan (November 20, 2024); (3) Calapaton (November 25, 2024); (4) Binoongan (November 26, 2024).
- 14. Conducted tree pruning at Barangay Sto. Rosario (November 5-6, 2024).
- 15. Capability Building for DRRM Line Agencies 2024 (DepEd KI) on November 11-12, 2024

Capability Building for DRRM Line Agencies 2024 (DepEd K2) on November 14-15, 2024

Capability Building for DRRM Line Agencies 2024 (DepEd K3) on December 16-17, 2024. This training is meant to capacitate the select teaching and non-teaching personnel of the Department of Education assigned at the area of responsibility of the municipality;. The **First Municipal Rescue Olympics** was also held this **year 2024** on July 29-30, 2024. In this event, 21 out of 35 barangays has joined, exhibiting their varying capacities in three categories: Rescue March, Fire Fighting Challenge, Rescue Challenge.

- 16. Due to pressing DRRM-related concerns, a third emergency meeting has been held, convening the MDRRMC members on October 29, 2024.
- 17. Two mandatory quarterly meetings have also been conducted, convening the MDRRM Council members of the municipality—Third Quarter and Fourth Quarter MDRRMC meetings.
- 18. The state of calamity has been lifted through MDRRMC Resolution No. 10 s. 2024 for the Effects of Dry Spell incident in the locality.
- 19. Conducted and activated the Incident Command System for the planned events: HOLY WEEK 2024 and UNDAS 2024.

- 20. The MDRRMC has also issued a total of 12 resolutions with the following issuances.
- 21. The MDRRMO has also compiled the necessary documents needed during the Seal of Good Local Governance 2024.
- 22. The MDRRMO and the MDRRMC has been tagged as one of the "Beyond Compliant" municipalities for the recently held Gawad Kalasag 2024 Seal of Excellence with a rating of 2.70.
- 23. The implementation of the Programs, Projects, and Activities comprising the Annual Work and Financial Plan of the Municipal Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Office are indicated below:

15. ENVIRONMENTAL SERVICES

In Year 2024, the Municipal Environment and Natural Resources Office (MENRO) was fully activated by designating an Officer-In-Charge with ten job order employees. MENRO was established to maintain, protect and preserve the environment to include communal forests, watersheds and other forest projects and other resources, manage and maintain seed banks and produce seedlings for forest and tree parks, provide extension services to beneficiaries of forest development and projects and render assistance for natural resources-related conservation and utilization activities consistent with ecological balance. It has also undertaken the Solid Waste Management Program by laying out policies for the effective disposal and utilization of solid wastes, enforce environmental laws, rules and regulations, intensify Information and Education Campaign on Solid Waste Management, provide technical assistance to target groups. The Sanitary Land Fill Facility Barangay Kalumihan is now operational. This year, the construction of the Sanitary Landfill in Barangay Tawas is underway and will be completed in Year 2025. The Municipality including its 35 barangays are now compliant with the requirements of Ecological Solid Waste Management Act No, 9003 and the guidelines of Gawad Pangulo sa Kapaligiran (GPK). Activities and program conducted by MENRO:

1. CONDUCT BENCHMARKING ACTIVITY FOR DEVELOPMENT AND MANAGEMENT OF CEMETERY

The benchmarking activity was held on January 25-26 in Bolonsori, Cagayan de Oro City and Gitagum, Misamis Oriental. It aims to gather insights and best practices for the efficient and sustainable development and management of cemeteries. This initiative seeks to understand the challenges, strategies, and innovative solutions implemented by existing cemeteries.

The Local Government Unit (LGU) of Kitaotao, Bukidnon is now developing the Municipal Cemetery Code, incorporating the best practices of LGU Gitagum and Cagayan de Oro City.

2. REVIEW AND ENHANCEMENT OF 10-YEAR SOLID WASTE MANAGEMENT PLAN

The review of the 10-year Solid Waste Management Plan aims to assess the effectiveness and progress of the strategies implemented over the past decade. This review focuses on identifying successes, challenges, and areas for improvement to ensure sustainable and efficient waste management in our municipality.

The primary purpose of this review is to evaluate the current solid waste management practices, update the plan based on findings, and recommend actionable improvements for the next phase.

3. CAPACITY BUILDING OF MEN AND WOMEN FOREST GUARDS AND FARMERS IN THE PROTECTION OF FORESTLAND

Deputation of Forest Guards

Protecting and preserving the environment is essential for sustaining life on Earth, safeguarding human health and well-being, and ensuring the prosperity of present and future generations. Intergenerational equity, is the idea that present generations should ensure that the natural resources and environment being use and enjoy are preserved and maintained for the benefit of future generations. Actions such as deforestation, overfishing, pollution, and habitat destruction can degrade ecosystems and deplete resources. After the capacity building the 35 Barangay Chairperson and 35 Barangay Tanod were deputized by DENR 10 as Forest Guards.

5. Conducted Monitoring of Materials Recovery Facility (MRF) Functionality of 35 Barangays.

Monitoring of the Materials Recovery Facility (MRF) will be conducted to guarantee its operational efficiency in the context of Solid Waste Management. This endeavor will enable the Solid Waste Management Committee (SWMC) of each barangay to gain insights into optimizing the functionality of the MRF, focusing on its key components: sorting, processing, storage, and load-out. Additionally, the objective of this initiative is to enforce the compulsory waste diversion target, thereby extending the usable lifespan of the Sanitary Landfill.

6. Conducted Search for Cleanest and Greenest Barangay (Gawad Pangulo sa Kapaligiran)

Human behavior in waste segregation is one of the most problematic areas in Solid Waste Management seeing lettering of garbage in public places and mix garbage or unsegregated waste at source. Air, rivers and creeks are becoming polluted due to lettering of garbage in that bodies of water. Citizenry are resistant to practice segregation and non-adherence to ordinances and policies. Since the functionality of the MRF depends largely on the kinds and proper solid waste segregation, it is therefore imperative to conduct Search for household practicing waste segregation at source as incorporated in the Search of Cleanest and Greenest Barangay to let people act on how to manage their own garbage.

ECOLOGICAL SOLID WASTE MANAGEMENT:

7. Conducted Training to Collectors and Personnel on Proper Handling and disposal of Waste and Other Environment Laws

The safety of waste collectors in the proper collection of solid waste is the main concern of this training since waste collection can involve handling hazardous materials, heavy objects, and operating equipment. This training ensures that collectors understand the safety measures to avoid accidents and injuries. It also helps to improve the efficiency of waste collection processes by teaching collectors how to optimize routes, handle different types of waste, and use equipment

effectively. This can result in cost savings and better for the entire areas of the municipality.

This training of waste collectors enhances safety, efficiency, environmental responsibility, customer satisfaction, and regulatory compliance in waste management operations.

FINANCIAL ACCOMPLISHMENT OF SEPTEMBER 2024

The Local Government Unit of Kitaotao together with the members of Kitaotao Union of Rank and File Municipal Employees (KURFME) has gained considerable momentum in the implementation of the PPAs included in the 2024 Budget. It has efficiently and effectively implemented the PPAs and delivered the needed basic services to the people resulting to the realization of adequate savings that maybe used to the grant of CNA as form of reward to the very good performance in the delivery of basic services to the 35 barangays in Kitaotao. The table below shows a very satisfactory financial accomplishment of 74.34% as of September 31, 2024 which is compliant of the target accomplishment.
